**PARKING OVERSIZED AND
RECREATIONAL VEHICLES**

The City of Monterey frequently receives complaints regarding oversized and recreational vehicles parked in the city. These complaints include vehicles parked for excessive periods, obstructing views of the roadway, unlawful dumping, blight, and other associated issues.

The city is seeking input from residents on the idea of restricting oversized and recreational vehicles on city streets without a permit. The intent of this ordinance would be to create safer streets and neighborhoods by minimizing the negative effects of oversized and recreational vehicles parking on city streets. Specifically, the ordinance would prohibit oversized and recreational vehicles from parking on city streets between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. and prohibit parking any such vehicle within fifty feet of an intersection at any time.

Residents may obtain a temporary overnight recreational vehicle permit, which will allow for overnight parking of RVs on the resident's block.

How do residents feel about this idea? Come to the July 10th NMNA meeting and provide your input.

STREET SLURRY ISSUES?

Are you concerned about the slurry job on your streets after recent construction? The City of Monterey has a 24-hour phone line where you can call and leave a message. Messages will be routed to the appropriate department for a response.

Come to the July 10th meeting and express your concerns as well.

CITY OF MONTEREY CONSTRUCTION

The City of Monterey has construction projects constantly taking place throughout the city. 
WANT TO GET INVOLVED?
