SMALL CELL WIRELESS UPDATE

June 26 Monterey Planning Commission held a study session on wireless facilities, lead by Joseph Van Eaton, attorney with Monterey's legal advisors, BBK Law. [Slides from that meeting are at <https://monterey.org/City-Hall/Featured-Projects/Wireless-Facility-News>]

Concerns discussed included health risks from small cell antenna RF emissions, a topic current FCC policy/law tries to forbid cities from considering; possible benefits from joining forces with other California cities in challenging that federal policy; visual blight from bulky equipment on streetlights & power poles and in multiple cabinets throughout neighborhoods; and fire hazard.

The Planning Commission requested that City Council authorize a subcommittee to work with BBK Law on revisions to the City's small cell equipment ordinance. Mr. Van Eaton recommends that detailed requirements be broken out from ordinance language and put into a standards manual, a faster/easier way to keep up with technology by updating standards than by revising the ordinance every time.

SPORTS CENTER WELLNESS LECTURE SERIES

Monterey Sports Center is expanding its *free* Community Wellness Lecture series to one Saturday afternoon a month. Topics have included Heart-health related talks, the Olympic Experience, Healthy eating and healthy snacks.
