### **SMALL CELL WIRELESS UPDATE**

Tuesday August 7 Monterey City Council will appoint a subcommittee of two Planning Commissioners and two community members to review in August a draft ordinance for recommendation to Planning Commission for September action, review approaches from other communities, discuss approach and format of new regulations (beyond the ordinance), and direct attorney Mr. Van Eaton to draft regulations for December Planning Commission action. City Council wants to adopt a revised wireless ordinance by October/November and new regulations/standards by January 2019.
